

Kap Gives Back Penny Raffle Rules

1. Participants ...
 - Must be 18 years of age or older to purchase a lottery ticket and claim a prize
 - Have to be located in Ontario while the ticket is purchased
 - Cannot have a revoked or refused registration under the Gaming & Control Act
2. Ticket sheets of 26 stubs will cost \$2 each and can be purchased with cash, debit, credit or e-transfer (e-transfer only available in-person at the Manor).
3. Participants may purchase any amount of 2000 penny raffle sheets, each with 26 ticket stubs, for chances to win any of the 100 prizes worth a total value of \$ 5,109.40. There will be a maximum of 52,000 ticket stubs.
4. How to play
 - Once purchased, ticket stubs must be placed into the container corresponding to the prize wished to be won.
 - Once deposited, tickets cannot be returned, refunded or transferred.
5. Ticket sales will begin on March 24th, 2026 and end on April 5, 2026, before the prize draws at 1:30 pm. The draws will take place at 1:30 PM at the Kapuskasing Sports Palace, 70 Brunelle Rd N, Kapuskasing, ON.
6. Prize donors, and staff and board members of the hosting organizations (North Centennial Manor, Sensenbrenner Foundation, Kapuskasing Food Bank) are able to participate in the raffle and therefore can have a chance to win. Penny Raffle managing staff are ineligible to purchase tickets and include Gary Fortin (Board Chairperson), Emilie Lemieux (NCM Administrator), Rhodson Odai (Fundraising Coordinator), Mireille Dubosq (Sensenbrenner Foundation), Laury Benson (Kapuskasing Food Bank). The families of those named above are still able to participate in the raffle.
7. All prizes are to be accepted as awarded. Each prize comes with no costs or hidden fees. There will be no exchanges, refunds or returns. Prizes may not be exchanged for any cash value unless specified otherwise.
8. Participants do not have to be present at the draw to be eligible to win a prize.
9. Draw winners will be advertised on the Kap Gives Back Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/kapyearendclassic>) and website (<https://www.ncmanor.com/community-main>). Every reasonable effort to contact the winner will be made, including: attempting to locate the winner using the contact information provided on the ticket stub, mailing letters and telephoning. If the winner cannot be reached, advertisements will be made on local radio within 120 days following the draw.
10. Any prizes which are not claimed within 1 year after the draw date (as per AGCO Lottery Licence Policy Manual) shall be donated to another non-profit organization other than NCM with the approval of the Alcohol & Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO).
