

- **IF YOU HAVE HAD CONTACT WITH A KNOWN COVID CASE – DO NOT VISIT THE MANOR FOR 10 DAYS AND FOLLOW DIRECTIONS OF PHU**
- **IF YOU VISITED THE MANOR AND LATER FOUND OUT THAT YOU HAD CONTACT WITH A COVID POSITIVE CASE, NOTIFY THE MANOR IMMEDIATELY 705 335 6125 Ext. 225 (office hours), Ext 244 after hours**

**Changes to visitation for Fully Vaccinated Visitors and designated Essential Caregivers.**

<p><b>Effective Wednesday, February 23</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• General visitors and Essential Caregivers (EC) that have a minimum of 2 doses of COVID-19 vaccine can visit the manor; your QR code will be scanned</li> <li>• General visitors and EC must be screened and swab-tested each time to enter the home; time has been set aside from 10:00-10:30 and 13:00-13:30 daily to test visitors and EC</li> <li>• Visitor/Essential Caregivers are limited to 2 per visit</li> <li>• An education leaflet will need to be reviewed and signed</li> <li>• Hairdressing services will be resuming</li> </ul>
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**1. Visitor and Essential Caregivers at the Manor**

- General Visitors and EC must meet ALL of the following requirements:
  - Provide proof of 2 doses of COVID vaccination;
  - Have not had contact with any COVID positive case in the past 10 days;
  - Have not had contact with anyone with s/s of COVID in the last 10 days;
  - Are symptom free;
  - Obtain a negative Panbio test from the Manor prior to visiting;
  - Are able to wear a medical mask for the full length of the visit; and,
  - Have read the education leaflet and signed that they understand.
- Each resident may have **4 specific Essential Caregivers assigned** by either the resident or the Next of Kin/POA that are allowed into the Manor at this time
  - please contact **705 335 6125 Extension 222** to identify which 4 Essential Caregivers are chosen
  - once chosen, there will be no temporary changes to the identified Essential Caregivers
  - if no specific Essential Caregivers are identified** the Manor will go back to the original two caregivers identified at the start of the Pandemic.
- These 4 identified Caregivers** (only 2 per visit) may provide care at the same time or individually any number of times per day provided they meet all the requirements listed in item 1. a. i-vii above
- PLEASE NOTE ALL VISITORS AND EC WILL HAVE TO WAIT OUTSIDE UNTIL THE RESULTS OF THEIR PANBIO TESTS ARE KNOWN**
  - It is strongly suggested that visitors/caregivers wait in their car due to inclement weather
- IF RESIDENT IS IN ISOLATION OR MANOR IS IN OUTBREAK**
  - Only 1 EC will be allowed at a time and general visitation will be paused.

**2. Compassionate Visiting**

- Visiting will be allowed for compassionate (end of life) reasons

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- b. This must be arranged in discussion with the Charge Nurse 705 335 6125 Ext. 244 (outside of regular business hours) or the Visiting Coordinator 705 335 6125 Ext. 222 (regular business hours)
- 3. Surveillance Testing**
- a. Anyone who passes screening will be Panbio tested
  - b. Only staff/physician/NP and regulated support workers will be allowed entrance into the Manor prior to results of Panbio tests being known
  - c. All others must have a known Panbio negative test each day prior to entering
- 4. Activities**
- a. Cohorting of residents within their own wings
  - b. Due to space limitations, only residents will be allowed at Activities
  - c. All singing performances are suspended
  - d. Hairdressing services will be resumed
- 5. Social Absences**
- a. Overnight and day social absences remain suspended **due to high level of community spread of COVID-19 at present.**
  - b. **Essential medical, compassionate and palliative absences** continue to be allowed with restrictions as follows upon return:
    - i. Resident must be screened upon return at the front door for s/s and exposure to COVID while out:

<b>KNOWN EXPOSURE to COVID while out on medical, compassionate or palliative absence</b>	<b>NO EXPOSURE TO COVID WHILE OUT ON medical, compassionate or palliative absence and mask worn at all times</b>
<b><u>Resident Vaccinated with 3 doses</u></b> Resident will be isolated and PCR swabbed on Day 5 of return. If PCR negative, they will be removed from isolation.	<b><u>Resident Vaccinated with 3 doses</u></b> PCR test on Day 5 No isolation needed unless a resident is positive on their PCR or resident finds out that while on pass, they had contact with COVID case
<b><u>Resident that is not Vaccinated with 3 doses</u></b> Resident will be in isolation for 10 days and PCR swabbed on Day 5 of return.	<b><u>Resident that is not Vaccinated with 3 doses</u></b> Resident will be isolated and PCR swabbed on Day 5 of return. If PCR negative, they will be removed from isolation.
***Be reminded that all residents in isolation are restricted to one essential caregiver who must wear full PPE during the isolation***
